

What is Homework Help?

Homework help (HH) is a lunch time support for students who do not turn in their homework on time. Students will remain in HH until the assignment is completed to the teacher's expectations, even if this takes more than one lunch period. Students are able to leave HH once they are caught up on their assignments, even if it is during the middle of the lunch period.

Once a student has received 6 assignment referrals to HH in 1 quarter, the student will be referred to Check In, Check Out (CICO).

What is Check In, Check Out (CICO)?

Students will be referred to CICO for Homework if they have earned at least 6 homework referrals in one quarter. Students will be referred to CICO for Behavior if they have earned at least 3 detentions and/or suspensions in one quarter.

The goal for CICO is to provide an opportunity for students to have positive interactions with adults at school, which will result in continued success. In this program, students will obtain a DPR (Daily Progress Report) which help students obtain data as well as positive feedback from their teachers each hour of the day. Throughout the day, students will ask teachers to rate their performance during class that hour. The goal is for each student to receive 80-90% of their possible points each day. Once a student has met their goal of 90% for two weeks or 80% for four weeks (the student chooses the goal), and the student receives no referrals for that time period, they exit the program.

It is our intent that student's overall attendance and achievement will increase significantly. Students who are not successful with Check In, Check Out, will be referred to a morning Social/ Academic Instructional Group.

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What is RtI and Do it RIGHT?



We strive to make our school safe and positive as well as a productive place for all students to learn. To be proactive and sensitive to individual behavioral and social needs, West Prairie High School has adopted a school-wide approach to behavior management using the Response to Intervention model, or RtI. This is a flexible problem-solving format that helps us provide timely assistance to students and match each student with his or her level of need.

The three levels of RtI

Level I: Universal policies in place for **all** students. This level includes clearly identified expectations, consequences, and ways of acknowledging positive behavior. Homework Help (HH) is a Tier I intervention. **See the behavioral matrix.**

Level II: Provides services to students who appear to need more than the universal interventions. These interventions may include checking in and checking out with a staff member daily (CICO) and/or attending a morning small group to work on needed skills, called a Social/Academic Instructional Group (S/AIG).

Level III: For students who have needs that exceed the interventions at level two. These are individualized student and family centered interventions.



RtI Incentives

- Student of the Month incentive: Students can be nominated by a teacher for Student of the Month if they have had no office referrals, no tardies, and no F's as an overall course grade for that month.
- End of Quarter Individual Student Incentive: Students who receive no more than 2 homework referrals in a quarter, no more than 2 tardies in a quarter, and no referrals in Lumen for behavior will earn the "Macomb Lunch Incentive." Students will be able to take school transportation to one of four pre-determined locations for lunch, which will occur on one school day during the entire 5th hour period. Students will pay the cost of their own lunch, although the school may provide a portion of the cost depending on funds and student need.
- End of Year Individual Student Incentive: Students who earned the Quarter Incentive for all 4 Quarters will be able to attend a field trip to Fun City, which will occur the beginning of the seniors last week of school. Students will purchase their own ticket at a full or prorated price, depending on funds and student need.
